Job Description

The successful candidate is expected to have strong familiarity and a broad background in aquatic,

terrestrial, and wetland ecosystems. Consulting and technical expertise and experience in national and state equivalent environmental regulations and environmental permitting is required. Experience in habitat conservation planning under the ESA, strategic planning and implementation of NRDA and ecological restoration techniques is strongly desired. He/she is expected to support identification and analysis of vegetation and wildlife, including studies of threatened and endangered species, preparation of technical reports, preparation of vegetation and wildlife maps, analysis of impacts of client projects on biological resources, development of mitigation and monitoring plans, preparation of habitat restoration and management plans, permit applications, and various biological resource documents and/or specialized reports for regulatory agency review.

A broad technical background is preferable to support clients and marketing activities involving baseline ecological studies, habitat restoration, environmental reviews, impact assessments and monitoring, applied research, participation in key stakeholder meetings, and management of projects (including supervision of field staff, client coordination, and proposal preparation). Field experience and technical knowledge is desirable in coastal and river habitat assessment/inventory, sampling methods and landscape/watershed studies.

The successful candidate must work effectively in multi-disciplinary teams in the preparation of client work products. He/she is expected to be proficient in the analysis and dissemination of information, and work cooperatively with agencies, organizations, and individuals to guide decision-making.
